

# HOT-AIR BALLOON FLIGHT

## TEOTIHUACÁN

Departure before the dawn to the Air Balloon airport near Teotihuacan. After check in we will be ready to flight over the “City of the Gods”. We will admire from above the Pyramid of the Sun, the Pyramid of the Moon, the Avenue of the Death and all the natural landscape around the archeological site. At the end of the flight, we will make a toast to our succesful flight and we will return to Mexico City with our Air Balloon flight Certificate

## HALF DAY

The "rancho" where start our adventure is located 30 minutes from San Miguel de Allende. After a little explanation to how to ride a horse, we will begin our itinerary with an exclusive acces to the canyon of this region. Arriving on the bottom of the canyon, we will ride in the river and take a break. We will continue reaching again the top of the canyon, admiring a wonderful landscape; here you have the possibility to do rappel on the side of the canyon

We will return to the rancho, and here we can have a homemade lunch composed by hot tortillas, fresh ranch cheese, organic beans, quesadillas, nopales, rice, chilly sauces, guacamole an salads.



# A DAY IN THE RANCHO

## FULL DAY

We will arrive at the ranch, located 30 minutes from San Miguel de Allende. We will start knowing the ranch and we will learn the daily tasks of life there; We will make tortillas and prepare sauces, if there are children they will be able to collect eggs and interact with the animals. After having breakfast and receiving the instructions to ride, we will go to the canyon; we will reach the bottom and we will be able to swim in the river, explore the roads and look for quartz. We will visit places impossible to reach on horseback and the possibility of descending one of the 50-meter cliffs by rappel at sunset, without a doubt, one of the best experiences.



## SELVA EL OCOTE BIOSPHERE RESERVA

Have you ever dreamed of living an adventure like those written by Joseph Campbell or staged by Indiana Jones? In Mexico you can bring this dream to reality, Chiapas is one of the destinations where you will find the ideal places to live experiences full of adventure and spectacular landscapes. In this journey we invite you to know the Selva El Ocote Biosphere Reserve, in it there is an important and complex underground river, in it we will make an interesting dynamics of the circulation of groundwater. Our main goal will be to reach the point known as the “La Venta River Time Arc”, the highest natural arch on the planet, 158 meters high, 255 m. long and 35 m. Wide.

# EXPEDITION

5 DAYS



## 1st day

Adventure capital

At noon, we will leave Tuxtla Gutiérrez, capital of adventure, with Address to the Unidad Modelo community, located in the perimeter area of one of the walls of the Grand Canyon of La Venta. Upon arrival, our guide-in-chief will give a security talk and present all the staff who will be in charge and deliver the personal equipment. We will start with a long walk (3hrs) through the Selva El Ocote Biosphere Reserve until we reach the river. Our night will be accompanied by the first bonfire inside the canyon.

\* Overnight in "base camp" inside the Grand Canyon of La Venta.

## 2nd day

It begins..

With the coffee ready and before dawn we will raise, in teams, our tents and accommodate our bags. After breakfast, we will start the ceremony to ask for permission and to be able to tour the canyon. After the ritual, we will start the walk where we can admire the majesty of the canyon walls. Before the sun covers us, we will arrive at the beach known as "La Cruz", the place of our second camp.

## 3rd day

Chains

With the camp set up and once we have had breakfast, we will advance inside the Grand Canyon, we will walk until we reach the area known as "Mini Collapse", a place that represents the greatest difficulty of our entire expedition. It will take us about an hour to cross this area where boulders stand out combined with rapids. We continue until we reach the first sequence of waterfalls "Las Cadenas" and at the end of the day we will arrive at the beach of the same name, to make our third camp.

## 4th day

Time Tunnel.

After breakfast and with the equipment collected, we continue the journey into the Grand Canyon, as we proceed, the canyon begins to become narrower and the water level rises with an emerald green color, here we can appreciate fish of different shades and a series of veins of water running down the walls. At the pace of silence, they disappear and give way to the imposing Arch of time, the end point of the route in the canyon

## 5th day


Back to the capital.

Just up, the staff will take us to discover the origin of the sounds that we could hear during the night; a sound generated by the siphons and the roar of the river. After breakfast we will begin with the extraction of equipment that accompanied us on the expedition and we will begin the ascent. We will climb individually with the necessary safety equipment and upon arrival, we will start with the walk in the Selva El Ocote Biosphere Reserve, We will travel a stony and rugged road, we will arrive at the point where our transport will be waiting for us to move us to the General community Lázaro Cárdenas, where a local restaurant immersed in the jungle, will be waiting with a good supply of food. At the end, we will return to Tuxtla Gutiérrez, capital of adventure, the final point of our expedition.

# EXPEDITION RÍO LACANJÁ

## MONTES AZULES, SELVA LACANDONA

Within the Montes Azules Biosphere Reserve, a privileged place on the planet lives: The Lacandon Jungle, one of the most biologically diverse regions in the humid tropics of America. We will raft a sequence of waterfalls and backwaters ranging from 1 to 4 meters. Here, we will be able to find the community called "Lacanja Chansayab", inhabited by members of the Lacandon indigenous group, who through the years have preserved their roots, have maintained balance and respect with Mother Earth. The Chankin family (little sun) will allow us to enter their culture and the close relationship that they have had for many years with the jungle, who has provided them with the necessary conditions for their existence and evolution.

# EXPEDITION

06 DAYS



## 1st day

The lost city.

Before dawn, we will leave the City of Palenque, have breakfast en route and continue to the Mayan Lacandones community, where we will begin our great expedition.

We will visit the city Archaeological Zone of Lacanjá, known as the Lost City, back to the river, we will continue paddling until we reach the Mayan triangle, we will visit the Archaeological Zone of Bonampak, while we visit it, part of the staff will stay and prepare the campfire for lunch - Dinner.

## 2nd day

Mayan Treasures

After our breakfast and having a delicious cup of coffee, we will continue our long expedition. Today, we will visit a very large archaeological site that today has no name but has temples on the two banks of the river worthy of being admired. We will enter the La Cojolita Reserve where a greater amount of fauna can be observed, as we go further we will lose contact with the populations and we will enter the Montes Azules Biosphere Reserve.

## 3rd day

Fauna.

In connection with nature accompanied by the singing of the birds, we will enjoy a good coffee and we will vibrate with the feeling of peace that this place offers us.

Today's tour will be full of large backwaters that will allow us to observe different types of birds, families of spider monkeys, listen to the choir of the Saragossa monkeys, the opportunity to see otters, macaw tapirs. We will end the day by the sea, at Playa Paz. where we will install our camp.

## 4th day

The Rapids.

On this day the adrenaline will take over us. The river will change when entering a very narrow canyon, we will find several small waterfalls. We will raffle rapids and arrive at a waterfall of approximately 15 meters. Our guides will apply various systems with the ropes to lower the rafts. The landscape is unique, as this point is the most virgin area of the Montes Azules Biosphere Reserve. We will continue sailing and when the afternoon falls, we will reach a beach where we will spend the night.

## 5th day

The last stretch.

We will paddle through a long backwater with several laps until we reach the mouth of the Lacanjá river. In front of the Lacantun river, flocks of macaws and howler monkeys will welcome us. Our ground team will be waiting for us like the food prepared; After storing the equipment and sharing our anecdotes, we will go to the Lacandonés Lodge in the Lacanjá community where we will have our dinner, take a bath and rest.

\*Overnight in Lodge Lacandonés.

## 6th day

The end.

Transfer to Palenque or Villahermosa Airport.

# TOURIST RESPONSIBLE CODE OF CONDUCT



## Contributes to conservation

Your payment of rights and wearing the bracelet is the entrance to the Protected Natural Areas, financially contributes to the conservation of these areas. If you want to participate actively in conservation, contact the personnel, guides or park rangers of the protected area.



## Take care of Natural and Cultural Heritage

Protected Natural Areas are everyone's heritage. Take care of animals and plants avoiding extracting, feeding or disturbing any species. Respect archaeological, fossiliferous areas and / or other elements of the material cultural heritage.



## Be careful with fire.

Fire is a potential risk for the animals and plants of the Protected Natural Area since they can cause uncontrollable fires. So we recommend avoiding it or bringing gas cookers with you. Only use specially designated areas. Never leave materials that can start fires, take care and put out your fire.



## Manage responsibly your waste.

If there are trash cans use them, otherwise take your trash please.



## Know and respect local communities

Much of the territory of a Protected Natural Area is owned by the communities or ejidos that live in or around it. The communities and their inhabitants have customs and traditions that are very interesting, get to know them, value them and respect them.



## Enjoy responsibly public facilities and areas

Ask about the facilities and public use areas, these are for you to enjoy responsibly and so that you do not damage or destroy them. Use the trails that exist and don't open new paths. Respect the signs.



# TOURIST RESPONSIBLE CODE OF CONDUCT



## **Respect other tourists.**

Remember that other visitors want to enjoy the Natural Protected Areas now and in the future. Respect other visitors by not making excessive noise or destroying what makes this area special. If you observe inappropriate behavior by other visitors, notify a park ranger.



## **Choose ideal clothes and equipment**

Find out the weather you will find in the Natural Protected Area and choose your clothes according to the weather forecast.



## **Respect Access roads**

Avoid taking your vehicle beyond the authorized sites, these deteriorate the soil and vegetation. Do not put them in conservation areas.



## **For your security, meet and know park rangers**

Chek in when you enter the Protected Natural Areas, warn about the activities that you are going to do for your safety and in cases of emergency. Obey the instructions and recommendations made by the area staff to avoid accidents.
